Watford Town Centre BID Ballot

12 September – 9 October 2025

Watford Town Centre BID are delighted to have confirmed more details about the upcoming BID ballot, where businesses vote for a third BID term from 2026 to 2031.

We have detailed plans for over £3million worth of investment for Watford Town Centre, but it will only be possible with a YES vote from our levy paying businesses in the formal ballot from 12 September – 9 October 2025.

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1. Introduction

About the BID

Formerly known as Watford BID, in 2023 we changed our name to **Watford Town Centre BID** to reflect the area we operate in and to coincide with the launch of the **Watford Town Centre** brand.

A Business Improvement District – or BID – is a way for local businesses to work together to tackle issues that affect their trading environment. Problems which are too large or widespread for any one business to address can be solved by all businesses coming together to finance and manage improvements. This can increase footfall, make it easier to retain staff, solve difficult issues and ultimately result in higher profits.

Watford BID Ltd was established in April 2016 covering Watford Town Centre. In 2021 our businesses voted in favour of a 2nd BID term, meaning that Watford Town Centre BID will continue to provide its service until 31 March 2026.

How to vote

1. You should receive one ballot paper for each property that you are eligible to vote for by post. If you do not, please email: enquiries@watfordtowncentre.com
2. Please check that each ballot paper has its own return envelope.
3. Complete the ballot paper putting a cross (x) beside your choice to retain the BID for a further five years or not.
4. Write your name in **BLOCK CAPITALS** and your **POSITION** in the business and then add your **SIGNATURE**.
5. Each ballot paper must be returned in its own separate envelope.
6. Return your completed ballot paper(s) by post in the pre-paid envelope provided. Or alternatively it can be returned by hand to Watford Town Hall.

There is a post box outside Watford Town Hall's customer service centre (CSC) entrance which will be regularly checked for returned ballot papers.

Cameron collects cardboard twice a week in our electric vehicle, with 50+ traders currently signed up. We are proud to have collected over 20 tonnes of cardboard since we launched the pilot scheme in early 2023!

Business Improvement Grant 2025/26

Applications are now open for the Business Improvement Grant 2025/26, giving Watford Town Centre BID businesses the opportunity to apply for funding of up to £2,500 per business.

The grant intends to support small and medium sized businesses by encouraging them to look at their business and identify potential improvements that could be undertaken to enhance their offer, maximise their business potential and improve the overall customer and visitor experience.

Last year, eleven businesses benefited from the programme, helping to create a more vibrant and attractive town for both shoppers and businesses alike. We are proud to have supported these initiatives - alongside Watford Borough Council via the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF) - and look forward to continuing efforts to boost the local economy in the future.

A more localised approach to vacancy rates - We're now focusing solely on Watford Town Centre's High Street when reporting vacancy rates. This more targeted approach helps us better understand local trends, identify why certain units become vacant, and highlight areas that are either thriving or may need support to attract new investment.

Watford Headline Metrics

- In Jul 2025, monthly retail sales in Watford were £14.6m. Year-to-Date (YTD) sales were £95.0m.
- Compared to Jul 2024, monthly sales marginally increased by +0.1% while YTD sales marginally decreased by -0.7%.
- The marginal increase in monthly sales was due to an increase of +2.0% in average revenue per customer (ARPC) and a decrease of -1.9% in customer numbers.

- The five sectors with the highest YTD sales are Fashion (£33.6m), Grocery (£19.4m), Food & Drink (£14.7m), Health & Beauty (£11.3m), and General Retail (£7.30m).
- The five sectors showing the largest change in sales between Jul 2024 and Jul 2025 are Tourism (-£187k), Fashion (+£181k), Health & Beauty (-£170k), Food & Drink (-£151k) and General Retail (+£148k).

5. Crime & safety

Watford Business Against Crime (WBAC) scheme

Watford Business Against Crime (WBAC) is a membership scheme, run by Watford Town Centre BID, which aims to reduce retail crime and anti-social behaviour throughout the town.

Benefits of joining:

- Exclusive access to intelligence about, and photos of convicted retail crime and fraud offenders.
- Participation in the WBAC Exclusion Order Scheme which sees persistent shop thieves banned from all member stores.
- Links to Hertfordshire Police through nominated PCSOs and police officers who work in Watford Town Centre.
- Monthly meetings to share intelligence.
- Free signage, stickers and crime prevention material.

Radio procedure guidelines:

- State what business you are.
- Be accurate with your information stating description of suspect, sex, nationality, colour, age, physique, skin, hair, outfit, and direction of travel.
- Keep your message short and include what has been taken and what way they are heading.
- Set your radio to an appropriate volume level. Log off when you finish your shift.

Retailer safety

Tip: Greeting customers can deter shoplifters

Retail theft is on the rise nationally, with a 20% increase in reported shoplifting offences in the past year. One simple tactic proven to help reduce theft is to greet customers within the first 3-5 seconds of them entering your store.

This small action:

- Creates a positive first impression for genuine shoppers.
- Makes potential shoplifters feel noticed and less likely to steal.

“If a thief thinks they’ve been spotted, they’re more likely to leave,” says the guidance.

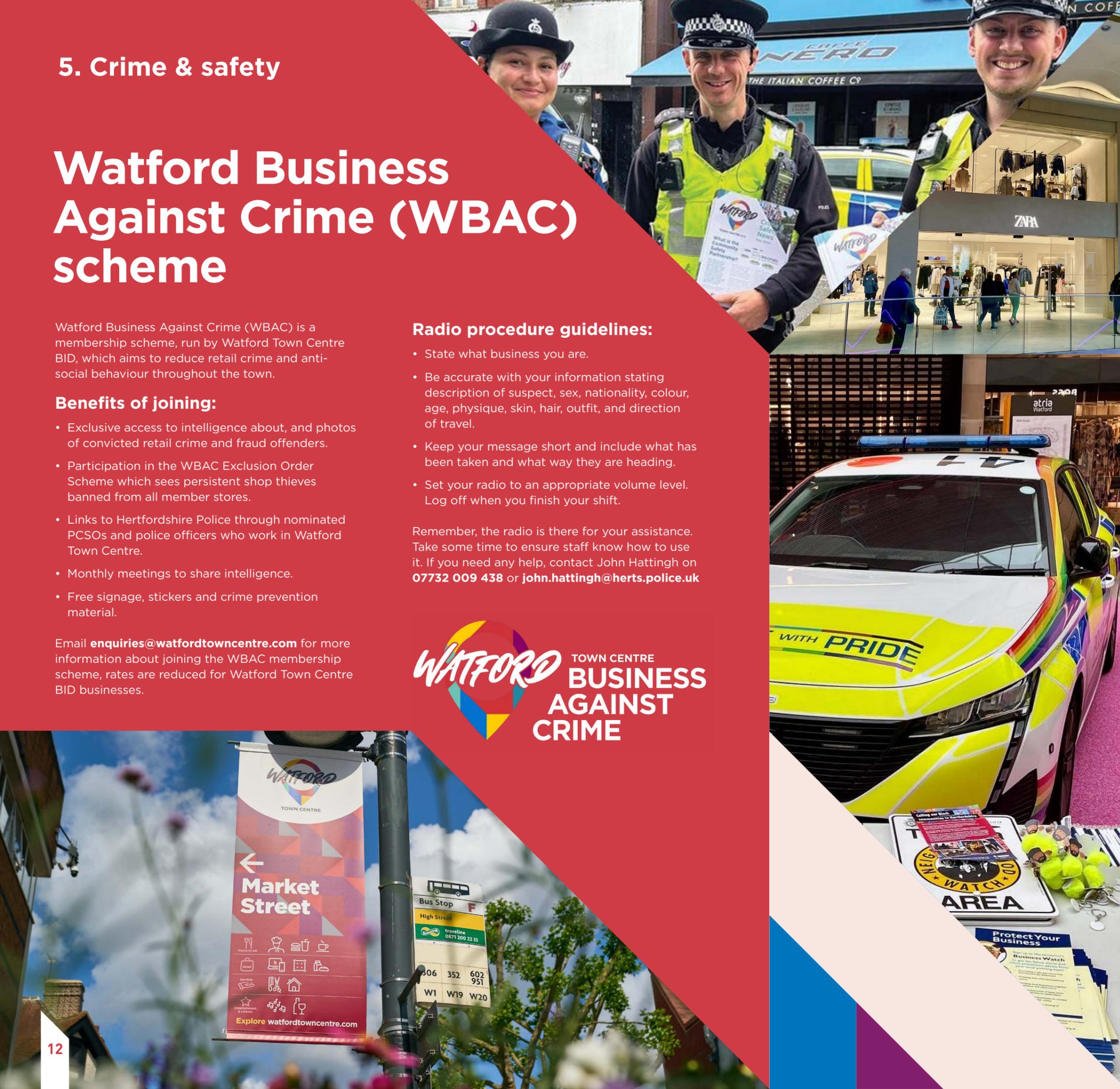
Stay alert, stay safe

- Thieves often target stores with only one staff member present. Where possible, ensure multiple staff are on the shop floor.
- Train staff to recognise suspicious behaviour and follow safe procedures.
- If you suspect someone may be stealing:
 - Keep a safe distance.
 - Ask if they need help or a basket.
 - If you feel uncomfortable, step away and alert a manager or security.

A note of caution

While engagement is a deterrent, avoid confrontation. Some individuals may become aggressive if challenged. Remember, if you’re a Watford Business Against Crime scheme member to use the radio to alert retailers, CCTV and security and Watford police.

This advice is part of Operation Vulture, a national initiative to reduce shoplifting and improve retailer safety. Working together as a town centre, we can help make Watford a safer and more secure place to shop and trade.

Watford Town Centre Winterfest is a wonderful **FREE event** to begin the Christmas period including funfair rides, festive activities, food & drink stalls, a high street parade and live entertainment.

Our BID-funded Christmas event takes place on The Parade, which will be filled with activities suited for all ages including funfair rides, a community feel and a fun festive vibe. As well as an extended **Watford market**, we will also have additional food, drink and community stalls, and some special **live performances**.

One of the main features of the day will be the **Winterfest parade**, which will begin at 4pm outside of Metro Bank and McDonald's on the lower high street. The festive parade will include a marching band, **costume characters**, local community groups plus more special guests. The Winterfest parade will last around 30 minutes and will move all the way up to the pond area on The Parade.
